- April has continued to be a trying month with a big workload for Simon and his team. There has not been a lot of rain since our last field day in March.

- The hinds on the hill have lifted in condition since weaning. Stags are to be pulled out at Tb testing from the MA hinds, and from the R2 hinds around 20th May.

- Final mating mobs and stags used were as follows:

Middle Hill	296	MA hinds	7	B11 stags
Swamp Block	289	MA hinds	8	Wapiti stags
Hydes	331	3 rd & 4 th calvers	7	MA Red stags
Airstrip	88	2 nd calving hinds	3	New R2 Red stags
Bottom Deer Farm	240	15 month hinds	8	MA Red stags

- The 40 positive and 7 suspicious Johne’s tested hinds in the 3rd and 4th calving hinds will also be pulled out at Tb testing. What to do with these will be discussed at the next community field day.

- Hind numbers wintered will be on par with last year. Increased numbers going forward will be subject to development.

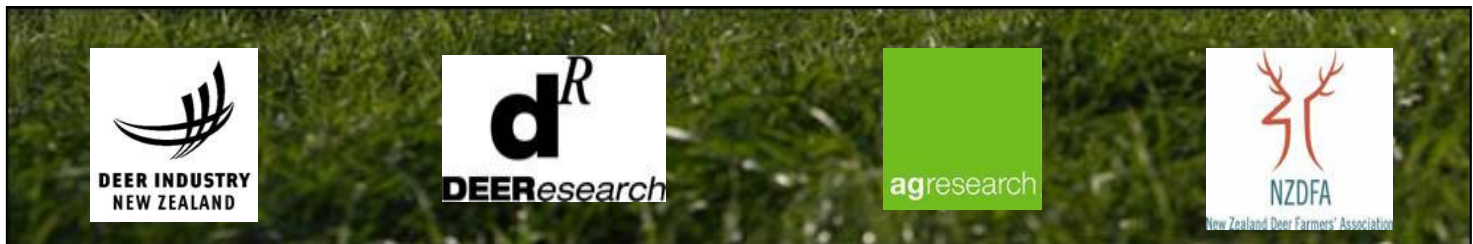
- Over the last few months Simon has been very focused on getting a guaranteed stock water supply to the deer unit and surrounding country. His progress and hurdles will be reported at the next field day.

- Breeding cows were weaned, pregnancy tested and Tb tested 19th - 23rd April. Tb testing has been a massive ordeal with a skin and blood test required. This required all cows to be kept around yards till 12th May.

- Pregnancy testing results were very pleasing with 7% empty in MA cows and 3.5% empty in R3 heifers. This has enabled a large proportion of older cows and late cows to be culled.

- Rams went out with the Black Face mob (1,526 ewes) on 10th April and with remaining ewes 18th April. Ewe numbers are back to around 11,100. Still 1,300 extra ewe lambs and 420 finishing lambs on board.

- The last two autumns have been trying for Mendip, with stock water becoming a major issue within the deer unit, change of breed in the sheep and higher lambing percentages. This coincides with better production levels in the breeding cow herd, but is complicated with a change in Tb status. Simon and Meisha are refocusing on their direction for stock numbers and classes of stock. We will present trends in stock numbers and productivity at our next community field day on 21st May.
